2A. CDIO ADVOCATE AWARD (DPCCE)

For individuals under DPCCE who have championed CDIO practices.

Criteria:

1. **Leadership in CDIO** – Demonstrated efforts to lead or promote CDIO initiatives.
2. **Capacity Building** – Contributions to training or mentoring others in CDIO.
3. **Innovation in Practice** – Application of creative approaches to teaching and learning within CDIO.
4. **Advocacy Efforts** – Active promotion of CDIO philosophy at local, national, or international levels.
5. **Documentation & Sharing** – Evidence of publications, sharing sessions, or resources developed.
6. **Sustainability of Initiatives** – Long-term impact or institutionalisation of CDIO practices advocated.
